

Jane, who managed Hillside for about 40 years, decided to go to Prospect Hill Cem, Caldwell, NJ.

Anna and her husband "Bert" Force went to Lawnside Cem, Woodstown, NJ in Southwest NJ.

The mother Sarah was nearly killed by **lightening** in 1869. She was walking from church with **Stephen Pierce** who died from the lightening strike. He was the 3rd Pierce/Pearce killed by lightening by 1869.

Ironically, Sarah married a Pierce cousin, Francis Henry Pierce, on 12/7/1871.



Francis H. Pierce, seventy-nine, no had lived in Montclair for more nan fifty years and was a lifelong sident of this section, died at his ome, 46 Northview avenue, Saturday erning from apoplexy. Death folwed a short illness. Mr. Pierce was born in West Caldell. For more than fifty years he ad been in business as a contractor ere. He was a member of the Union ongregational church and of the ontclair Lodge, Royal Arcanum. He leaves a wife, Mrs. Sarah Vanrhoof Pierce; four daughters, Mrs. parlotte Pierce Clute, Mrs. Herbert irce and Miss Jane M. Pierce, all of ontclair, and Mrs. W. H. Hoagland Verona, and two brothers, Albert erce of Verona and Sylvanus erce of West Caldwell. Funeral services were held at the me at 2:30 o'clock Monday afteron. The Rev. Georg C. Vincent, stor of the Union Congregational urch, officiated. Interment was in inton cemetery, Caldwell Township.

Mr. Pierce died Saturday from a stroke of apoplexy after an illness of three weeks. He was born in West Caldwell seventy-eight years ago and had been a resident of Montclair more than fifty years. In business he was a contractor. He was a member of the Union Congregational Church and also held membership in Montclair Chapter, Royal Arcanum.

Besides his wife Mr. Pierce leaves four daughters, Mrs. Charlotte Pierce Clute, Mrs. Herbert Force and Miss Jane M. Pierce, all of Montclair, and Mrs. W. H. Hoagland of Verona.

Clinton Cemetery is **Hillside Cemetery**. Clinton was the name for the Horseneck Road section of Caldwell Township (Fairfield).
