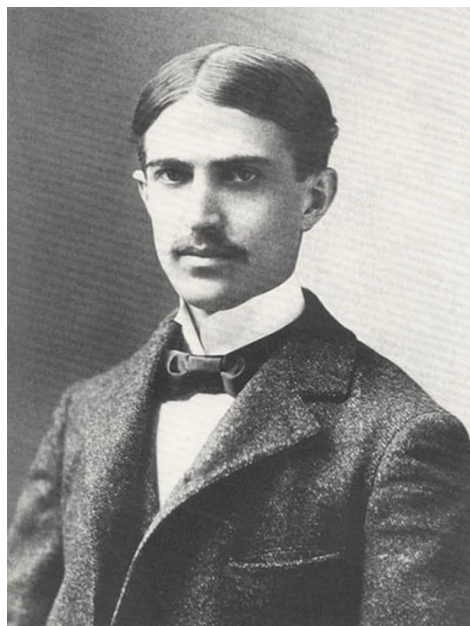


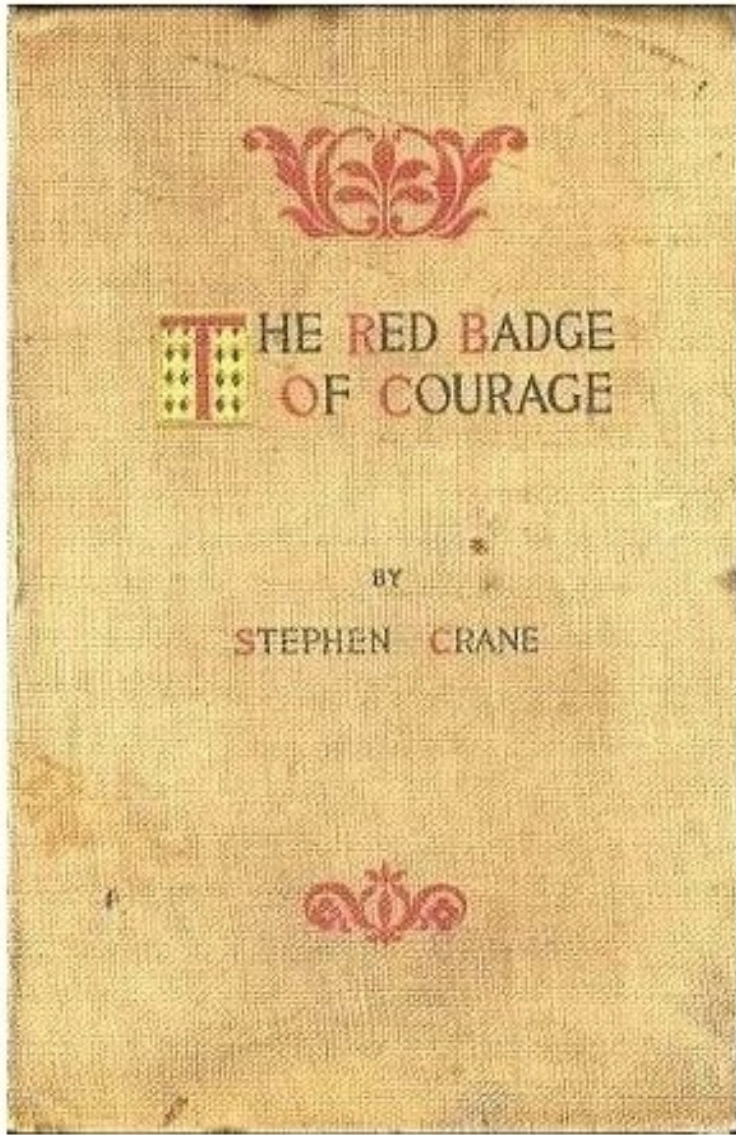
**Stevie Crane** (1871—1900) descended from Jaspar Crane, a founder of Newark NJ, who had migrated there from England in 1639. He enters the Pearce tree via the 1786 marriage of his relative **Job Crane and our Elizabeth ‘Betsey’ Crane**. Job lived in Fairfield NJ near Two Bridges Road.

Stevie struggled as a writer. “Crane wished to show how it felt to be in a war by writing “a psychological portrayal of fear. Conceiving his story from the point of view of a young Private who is at first filled with boyish dreams of the glory of war and then quickly becomes disillusioned.” (2024 Wikipedia).

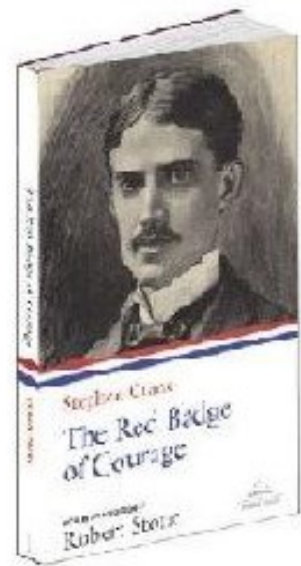
The book was called ‘**Red Badge of Courage**’. A 1951 movie was made starring WW2 hero Audie Murphy and Bill Mauldin. Syracuse University has an annual Stephen Crane Lecture Series.

Stevie had a difficult life. He died 1900 in Germany. His girl friend had Stevie brought by ship to Evergreen Cemetery located in Hillside, NJ.





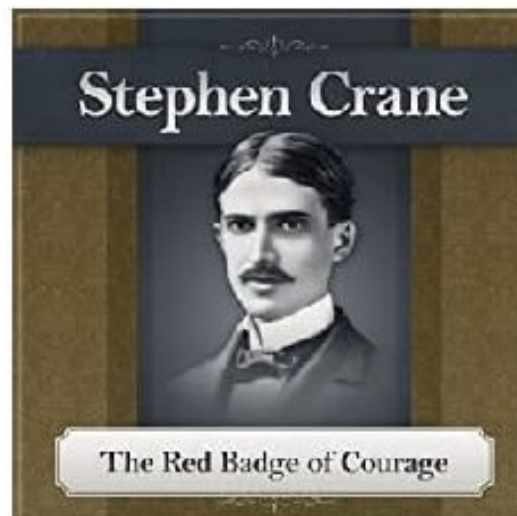
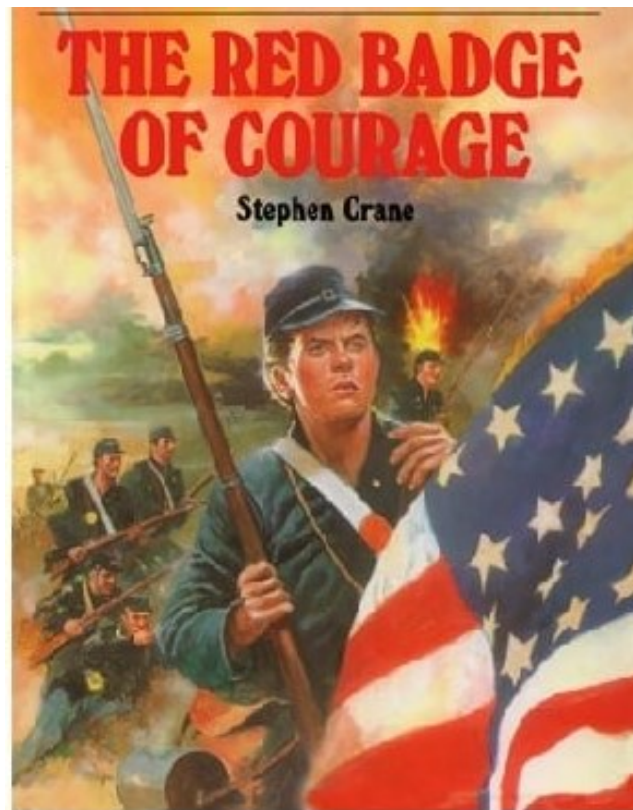
1895 first edition

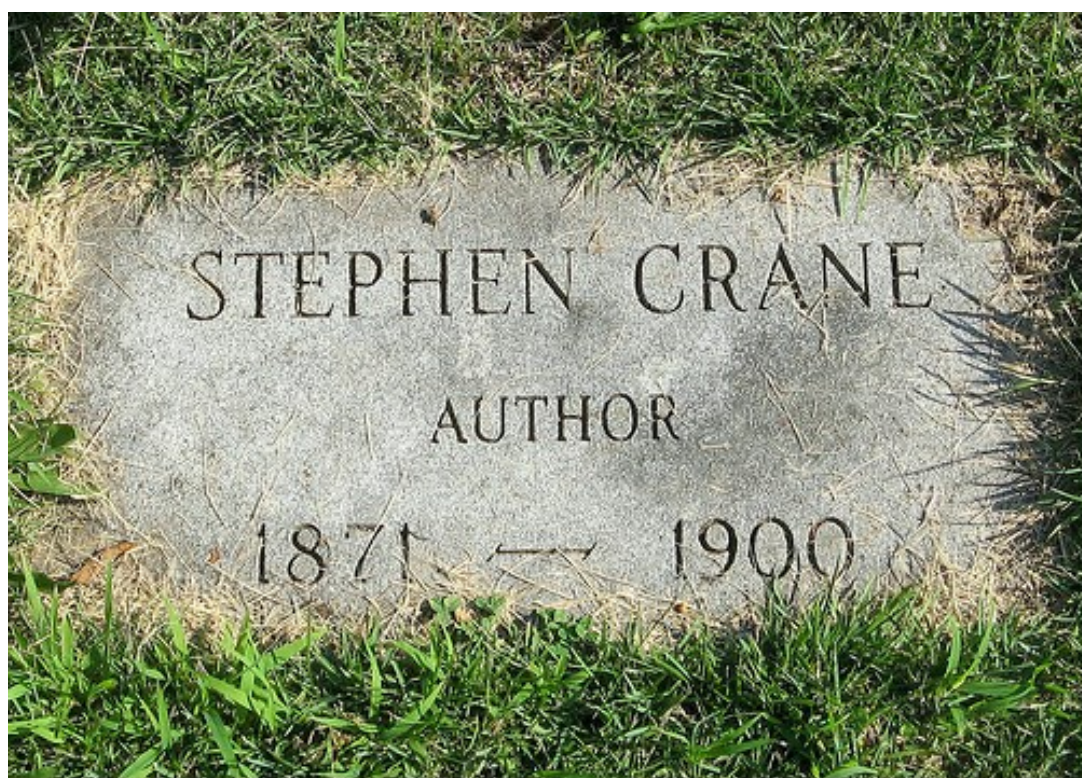


1871—1900 (28)
