Fairfield NJ, Middletown NY and Bronx, NY


Henry Harrison Pearce branch #2, generation #5.

1885—David Henry Pearce resided in Caldwell NJ with **Jacob Fredericks VAN NESS** and wife **Margaret Bond Van Ness**. They must have been a wonderful couple.

Their son **Gilbert O. VAN NESS** married our **Mary Louise PIERCE**, who was an aunt to David. David is on branch #2 and Mary Louise on branch #3, the same **#3** branch as **Jill Pierce Bingler**. The mentioned people lived near Hillside Cemetery.

Jacob and Margaret had 7 children. By 1885, their children were adults with ages 30 to 40.

These people are buried at Hillside Cemetery.

By the way, Mary was a born before her brother, our Albert Pierce.

The Gilbert and Mary Pierce Van Ness home was on Horseneck Rd close to the cemetery. When entering the cemetery, the house would have been about 150 feet down on the same cemetery side. Where there are new condo homes. Their deserted home burned down around 1975.

1910—David was living in Middletown New York, working as a 'chair cane maker'. He is noted in the 1910 NY Census as being 'divorced'. I don't find his wife.

1914—lived at 125 West Main Street (Confectionery Store) in Middletown, NY.



Theodore Sanford Pearce son of Mark Pearce.

About 1885 or so, David moved to Middletown NY, down the street from his stepbrother Theodore. Their other 2 young siblings William and Evaline died earlier as did both mom's (Ellen and Eliza). Their father Mark was still alive.

In 1895. Theodore was age 29 and blind David age 44. Theodore was a postman in Middletown, NY.

The dad Mark died 3 years later in 1898.

Theodore and David were the only living members of this family unit.

1900 Theodore lived at 10 Olwer Ave, Middletown, NY working as a painter.

1907 Theodore lived at 75 West Main St, Middletown, NY. David lived on the same street at 125 West Main Street. Glen remembers walking many times on that street in 1965-67 when he attended nearby Orange County Community College.

In the 1895, Theodore was age 39 living with his family in Middletown NY. He worked as a mailman. It appears that David lived down the street in Middletown, NY.

1910—David Henry Pearce age 59 lived in Middletown New York, working as a 'chair cane maker'. The 1910 NY Census shows David 'divorced'. So far, I don't find David's wife.

The 1910 census shows Theodore Pearce and family living at 247 West 111th Street, NYC working as a salesman and house painter.

It appears that David stayed in Middletown NY until 1923 or so.

1914—Mrs. **Jane Pearce Mulford** died 3/9/1914. Her WILL thoughtfully gave nephew David, **age 62**, \$1,000 per year for life. **\$1,000** in 1914 is equivalent in purchasing power to **\$32,000** in 2025 money.

In 1914, the average annual income in the United States was around \$574, with state and local government workers earning slightly more at \$699 and public school teachers earning \$492. (Google 2025)

Therefore, David's \$1,000 per year for life was above average.

The US started the income tax in 1913 but it was 1% for income over \$6,000. So David was not affected.

Aunt Jane was the 7th and last child of Henry Harrison Pearce and Maria C. Bush. Her brother Mark Pearce was the father of David.

Jane is Glen's number one all-time relative. She and her husband **Henry Mulford** did not have children. They are buried at Hillside Cem.

They were generous with their money for family members. Jane managed the cemetery for about 40 years.

NOTICE 18 HEREBY GIVEN to Mahnil Quackenbush (widow of David Quackenbush, deceased,) Martha Quackenbush, Franklin Quackenbush, and all whom it may concern, that the subscriber, who claims to be tenaut in common of the undivided one-fifth part of certain land and real estate situate in the city of Newark, in the county of Essex, and State of New Jersey, being the house and lot, or homestead, whereof the said David Quackenbush, deceased, lately died selzed, and whereof the said Martha Quackenbush, Franklin Quackenbush, Henry Quackenbush and Abrahall Quackenbush are each entitled also to an undivided fifth part, subject to the right of dower of the said Mahahall Quackenbush therein—will make application to the Orphans' Court of the County of Essex aforesaid, on the twenty-second day of September next, at the bour of ten in the forencon, or as soon thereafter as the same can be heard, for the appointment of Commissioners to divide the said premises between the said owners in the shares aforesaid.

David Henry Pearce petition for his late mother's share of David Quackenbush's estate.

Petition filed on behalf of David Henry Pearce, son of Mark Pearce and Mary Eliza Quackenbush, seeking a share of the estate of his grandfather, David Quackenbush. The 1920 US Federal census shows David owning and living at 125 West Main St in Middletown, NY. The brick building may have been his shop for making 'cane chairs'.

Maybe the grey building was his home???

As a blind man, David must have struggled in life. David is on the branch #2 with parents Mark Pearce and Mary Elizabeth 'Eliza' QUACKENBUSH.

Sometime in mid 1920s, David moved to a Bronx, NY home for the blind. After David died in the Bronx on 10/30/1927, his Pearce and Van Ness relatives made sure that David was buried at Hillside Cem. I hope he has a tombstone.

I bet the the 2025 Pierce's would have helped David during his lifetime. Glen.
