Next to Louise is her mother Mrs. Theresa Schaefer James 1860-1910.

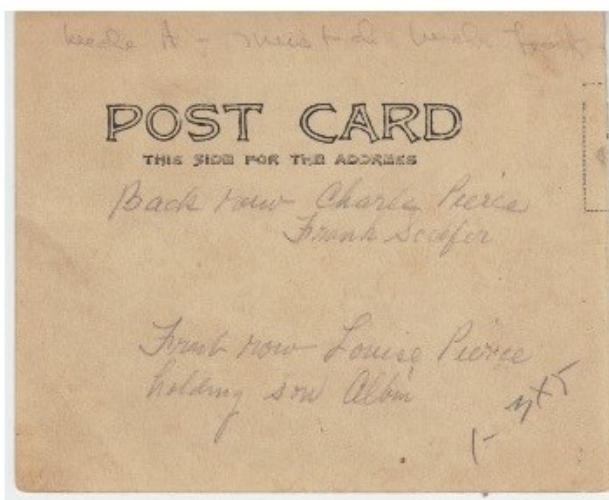
Back L-R is Charles Small Pierce 1883-1944 age 23 father to baby Albin.

Albin Schaefer

Albin Schaefer, 82, of 25 Valley Road, Clifton, died yesterday afternoon after a short illness. Born in New York City, Mr. Schaefer lived in Paterson most of his life. A retired musician, he led a government band from 1889 to 1902. He was a member of the Paterson Orange Lodge, F. and A. M., and the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Post No. 1801, Paterson. Surviving, are a brother, Francis Schaefer, of Florida, a nephew, James F. James, at whose home he resided, and a niece in California, Mrs. Louisa Pierce.

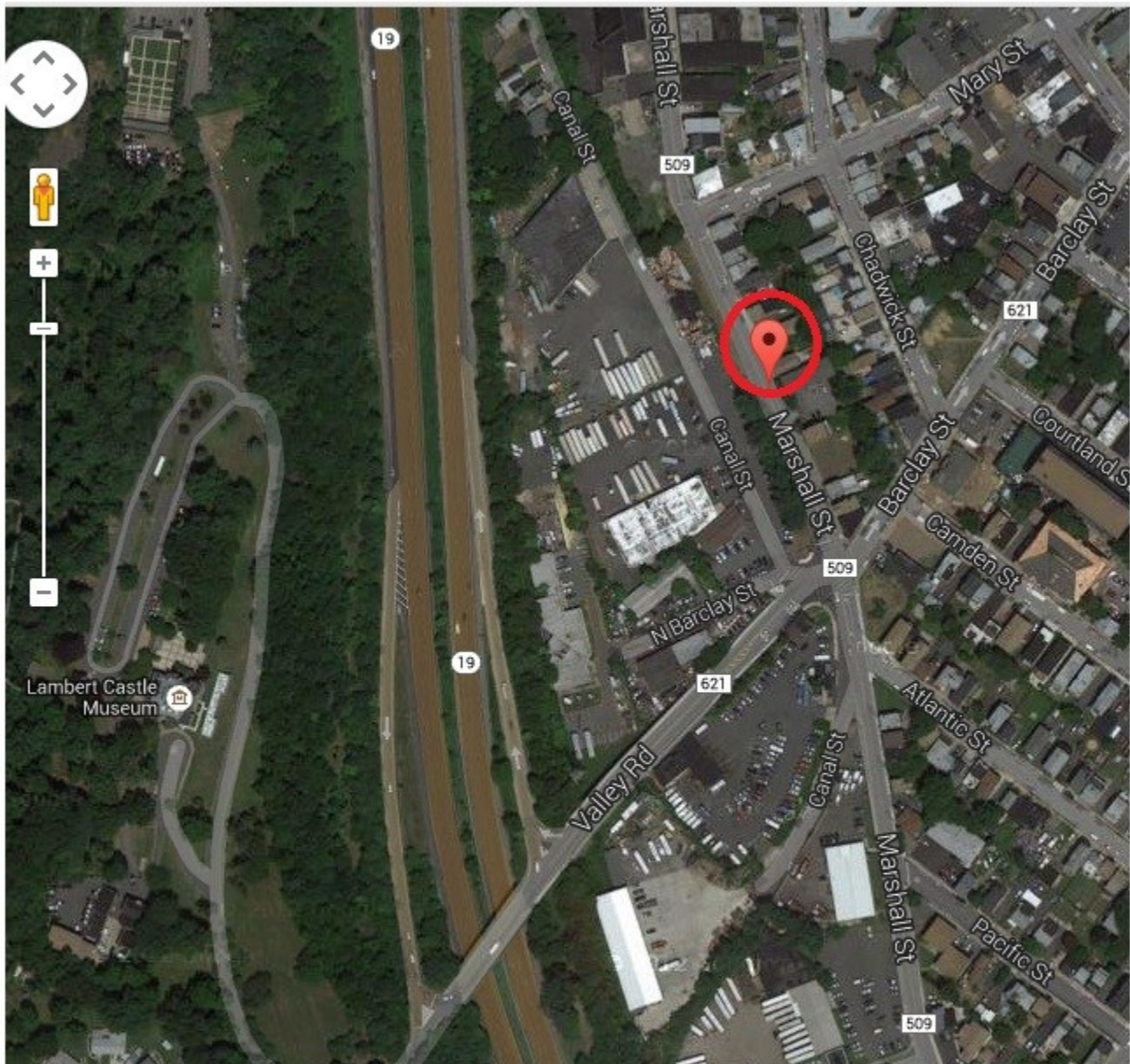

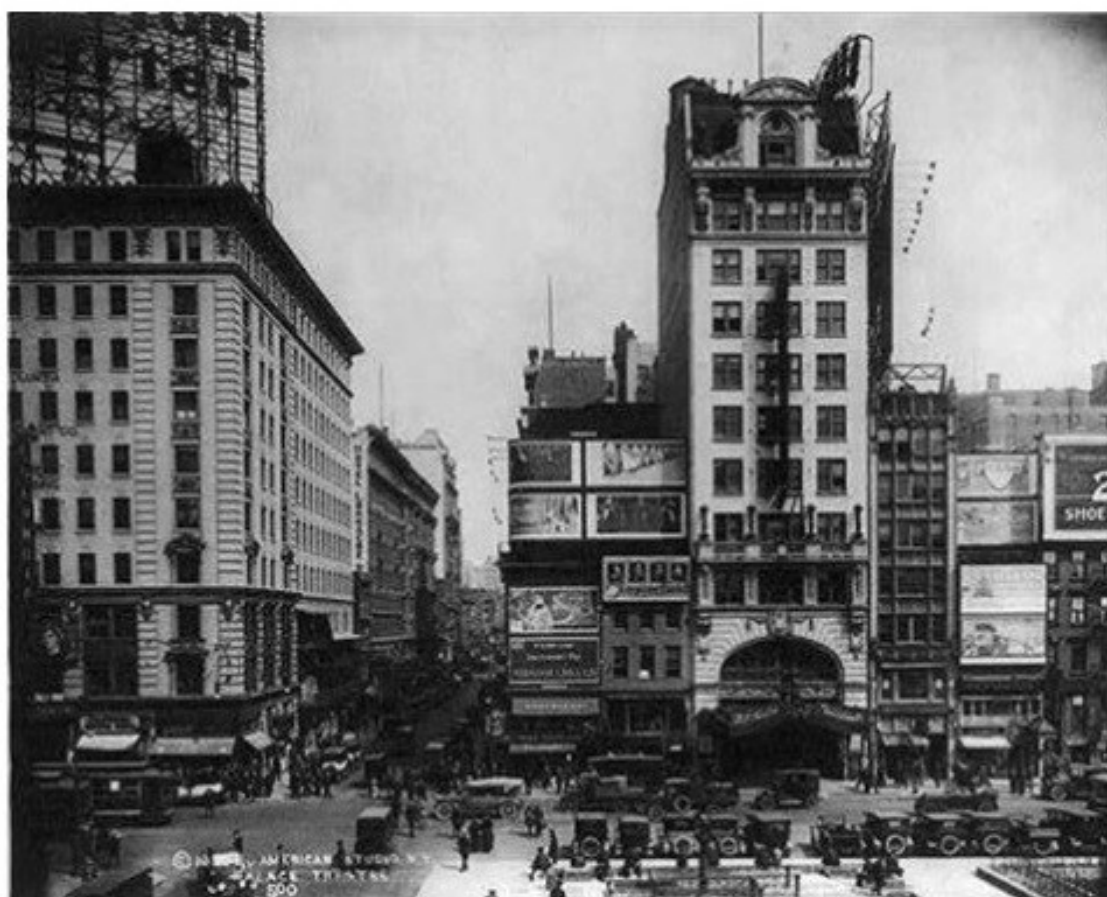

This 1910 Paterson Census worker really messed up everyone's firstnames.

However, the gist is - Albin Pierce was born in 1905 according to this census. He was born after his parents married in 1904.

He was living with the Schaefer's and James families.

Alfred Shaffer should be Albin Schaefer. Tresa James is his sister Mrs. Theresa Juliane SCHAEFER James.

Charles is our Charles Small Pierce. His wife Louisa is Mrs. Louise Caroline James Pierce who was born 1885 and is correctly age 25 in 1910. Their son Allin Pierce is really Albin Pierce. Says age 4 because he turned 5 after the census on 9/3/1910.

John Francis James is the brother of Louise. John later married Aunt Doris Turner.

Rosie James is Louise's sister.

I don't know the 2 year old Louisa James connection. Maybe a daughter of John and Doris ?? Glen 4/22/2014



Mr. Frank Venino, whose death we recently announced, was buried on Saturday last in Union Hill, N. J. Mr. Frederick Schaefer delivered an address and the members of the Gesangverein sang at the grave. We are asked to make some corrections respecting Mr. Venino's career and works. The artist was born at Kaiserslautern. In 1833 he entered the Munich Academy of Art. He early attracted the attention of Schwanthaler and Kaulbach. A sketch of Barbarossa earned him great praise, and a picture of his on the same subject hangs in the Rathshaus at Kaiserslautern. During his ten years' sojourn at Munich he was a constant contributor to the *Fliegende Blätter*. In consequence of the abdication of King Ludwig I., of Bavaria, he had to give up his projected journey and study in Rome, and in 1849 he came to this country. His most important paintings produced here are "The Destruction of Carthage" and "King Lear." Ten years of the artist's life were spent in Washington; the last ten were devoted to the charge of the Art School in the Cooper Institute. He leaves a widow and two sons.

 Maybe this Frank and Albion are uncle's of Albin Pierce.

Furthermore, the section on the Clifton / Paterson border where 1905 Charles and Louise Pierce lived was named Albion Place (really 3 streets). Glen lived on one of those streets in 2003 called Warren St. Clifton NJ

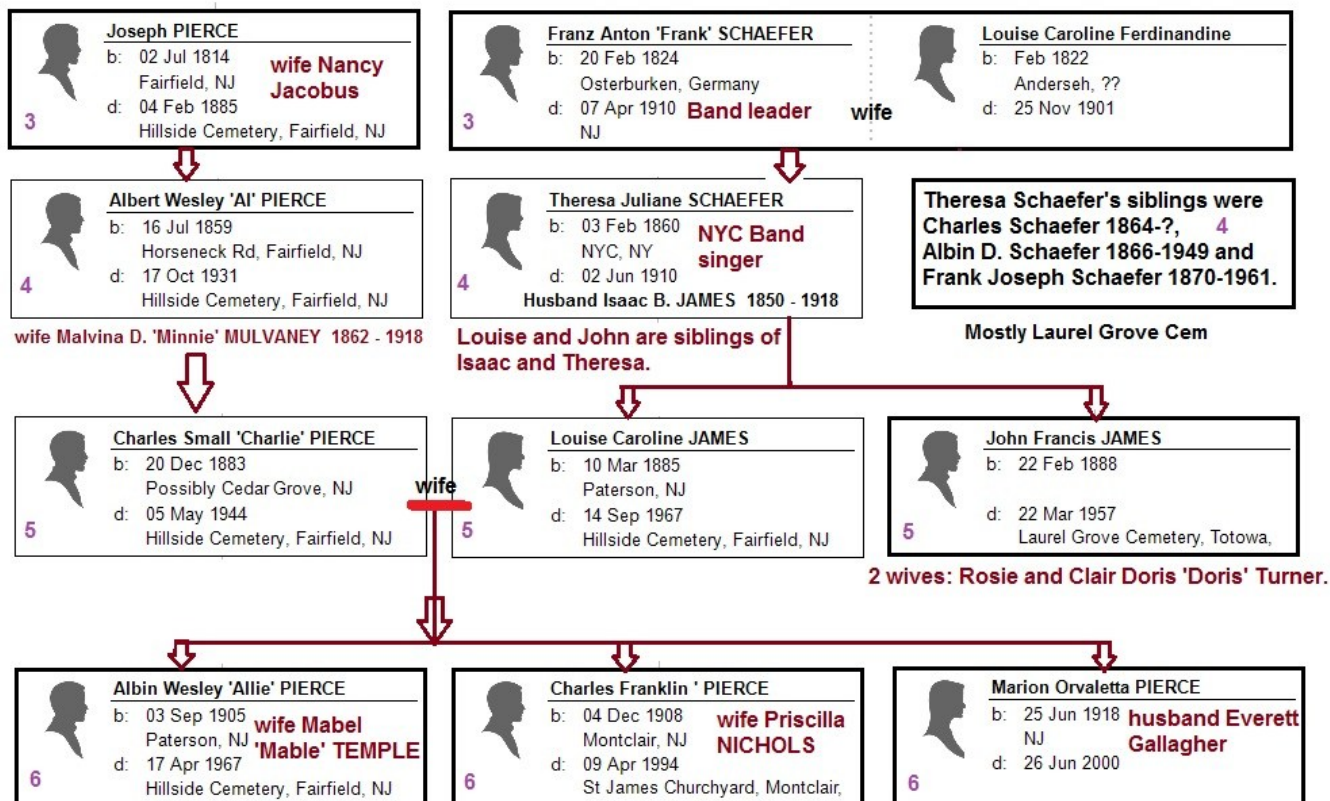

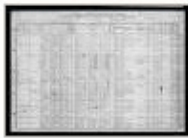

History

TWO HUNDRED AND FIRST REGIMENT, INFANTRY.

Under the provisions of general orders, No. 8, general headquarters, state of New York, adjutant-general's office, June 27, 1898, this regiment was organized at the armory of the twelfth regiment, national guard, New York city, and recruited in that city and Brooklyn.

Recruiting commenced about July 10th. preference being given to members of the national guard.

Companies A, C and I were mustered in July 16th; companies D and E, July 17th; companies G- and 11. July 18th; company F, July 21st; companies K and M, July 22d; company L, July 23d, and company B, July 26. 1898.

As soon after muster-in as practicable, companies were sent to and the whole regiment assembled at Camp Black, Long Island.

September 9th, the regiment left Camp Black, and proceeded to Camp Meade, via Long Island railroad to Long Island City, by ferry from Long Island City to Jersey City, via Central Railroad of New Jersey, and Philadelphia & Reading railroad to Middletown.Pa., where it arrived about daylight.

September 10th, breakfasted and marched two and one-half miles to camp near High Spire, Pa., previously occupied by the sixth Pennsylvania regiment. The third battalion occupied four separate company camps and performed three weeks provost duties.

A picked battalion, under the command of Colonel Hubbell, attended the peace celebration at Philadelphia, Pa.

November 15th, the regiment proceeded via Baltimore, Washington & Southern railroad to Greenville, S. C. where it was assigned to the second brigade, second division, second army corps, the camp of all the troops being known as " Camp Wether-ill."

During the stay of the regiment at this point Lieutenant-Colonel Edmund P. Cottle was detailed as provost marshal at Greenville. He performed his duties in such a manner that he received the full appreciation and commendation of the commander of the division in an official communication, and the citizens of Greenville presented him with a sword and belt as a testimonial of the valuable service rendered by him.

The war ended on December 10, 1898 with the signing of the Treaty of Paris between Spain and the U.S.

Before leaving Camp Meade the regiment received orders assigning it to duty near Havana, Cuba, and in February, 1899, it was ordered to Augusta, Ga. These orders, however, were not carried out.

The regiment was mustered out at Greenville, S. C, **April 3, 1899.**

Albin d. schaefer's card shows him leaving 4/3/1899. But it looks like he stayed in the army until **July 1901.**

Remember to look at family tree maker notes per person.

Isaac James—born in usa. living 1885 in newark nj. Did he have other children named Mary E. and Cynthia james ??

At first, I thought his father was H. I. James. Machinist living at 30 Passaic, Paterson, NJ in 1876. Hopefully, he did not die from the Flu.

Theresa Schaefer James: Sunday evening 11/19/1876 age 16 singer in her music conductor father's band at 334-344 West 44th Street, NYC, NY at the 2nd annual Friendship Literary Aid Dramatic Association. In 2013, the building is now a Comfort Inn.

Per Glen: I remember about 1956 going with grandpa Albin Pierce to pick something up at a Schaefer house on Grandview Ave, North Caldwell, near the bend at top of hill.

US Census says her birth was Aug 1859 however, Glen received an 1863 document from Caroline Pierce Wescott in 2013 that shows Theresa's birth as Feb 3, 1860.

Theresa must have been divorced from Isaac James by 1900 although he appears in a 1906 family photo. Do not know for sure but Isaac does not appear in their 1900 and 1910 census with the rest of the people.

Theresa died 2 months after her dad.

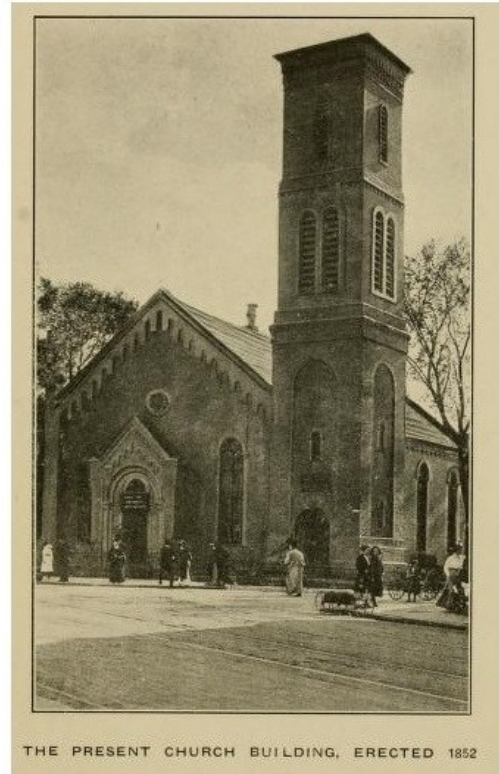



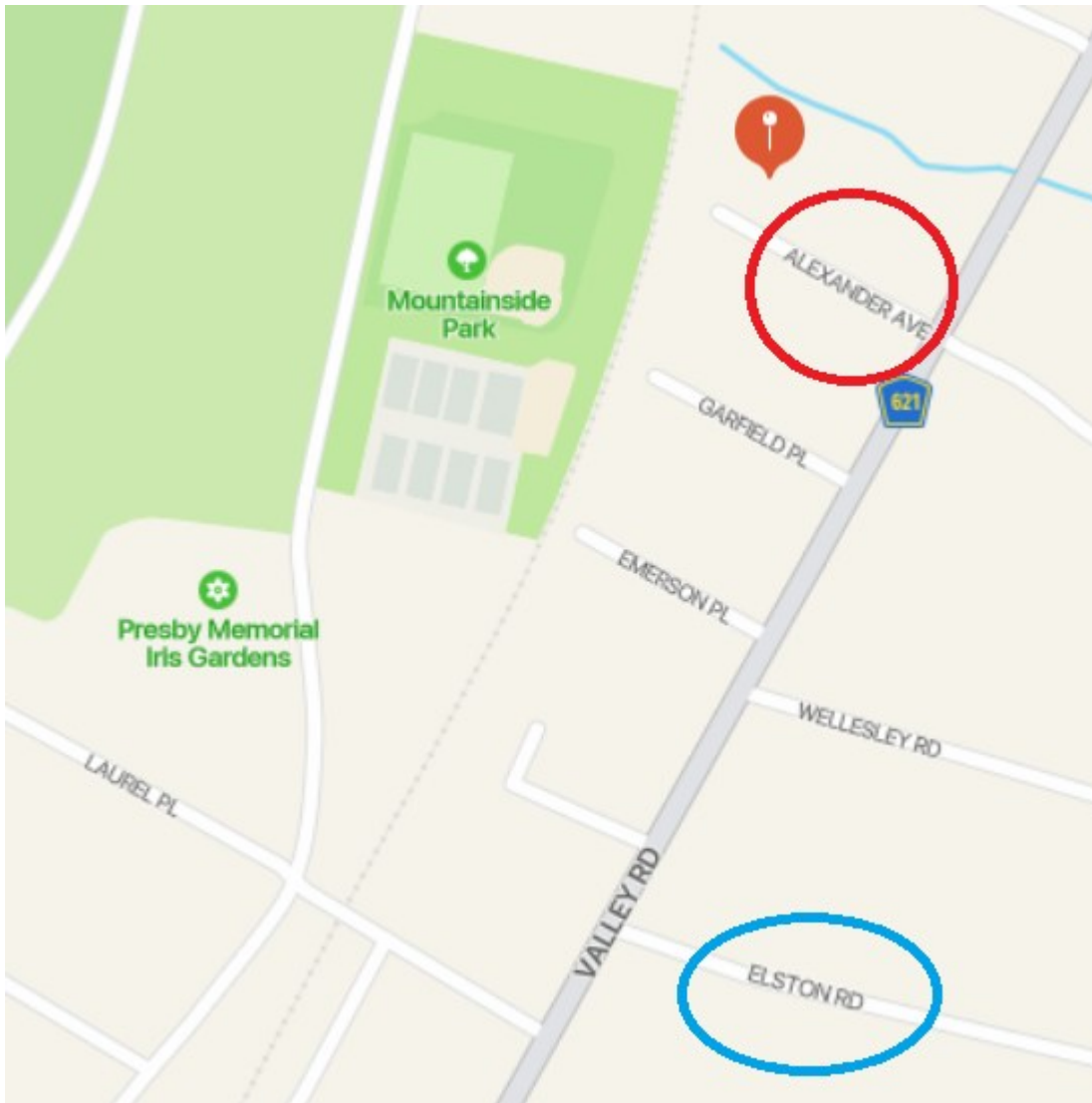

Dear Joe and George –

While looking around my genealogy sources to help further prove to Joe that Gramps Albin real middlename was 'Wesley', I ran into something interesting.

I found his father Charles Small Pierce 1942 Draft Card. He wrote his birth as 12/20/1884. He wrote the wrong year. Should be 1883.

So I went to the Trenton Archives to find more info. In chronological order, here is what I found that proves 1883 is his birth year. Attached are copies of all these things.

1 – **1873 BIBLE**: I have the Albert Wesley Pierce Bible (spelled that way by the way). He was the father of Charles Small Pierce. Albert wrote his son's birth correctly as 12/20/1883.

2 – **1883 BIRTH CERTIFICATE (BC)**: After 30 years, I found the 1883 BC for Charles. It was filed in a miscellaneous batch of records. The BC had NO NAME !! for Charles. It was **blank**.

That 1883 BC spelled his dad as Albert Pearce. The old spelling.

They identified the wife as Minnie Houliston. Minnie was born Mulvaney. After her father Patrick Mulvaney was killed in an 1864 train accident, the mom Sarah remarried to a Houliston. There were children from both marriages. Hence, Minnie was sometimes identified by her step father's name of Houliston.

Kind of like Freddie and Michele who early on used Gathman and Pierce but decided to stick with Gathman.

So Charles had no name when the BC was filled out.

I attach a light and darker copy. Plus the Trenton reel number.

As a sidebar, I tracked down the great grand kids of the each doctor who brought Charles and Albin into the world. They had no extra records.

3 – **1942 DRAFT CARD**: It appear that Charles wrote the card out himself.

He incorrectly shows an 1884 birthyear but 1883 is the correct year. Maybe he shaved off a year in order to fight in the war?

4 – **1944 DEATH CERTIF**: Son Albin filled out the paperwork and used 1882 by mistake. 1883 is the correct birthyear.

5 – **1997 TOMBSTONE**: Grandson George did a nice thing in getting Charles and Louise a stone. He asked me for the year and at the time in 1997, I only had 1873 Albert Wesley Pierce Bible (generation 4) that showed 1883 for his son Charles. That Bible was 100% accurate with a lot of info.

So now we know. Charles and Albin had 3 birthyears assigned to them but 1883 and 1905 respectively were the correct birthyears.
