



Tom Provost #3 grandparents lived here. They were Tom Provost #1 and **Fannie Backus**. Fannie brought in the Pearce linage.



The area is now the site of the Caldwell Municipal Building and Kiwanis Oval which was built in the early 1930's. The brook now runs underneath the Caldwell Firehouse on Roseland Ave., meanders in back of houses on Westville Ave. and finally to the Grover Cleveland Park Pond. The street which leads to the municipal building is named Provost Square in honor of the family that once owned the property. 




Tom Provost #3. Probably age 2 in 1914. Received photo from his daughter Susie Provost.







Tom Provost #3 in 1914.




1930 Clarion Year Book, Caldwell High School, Caldwell NJ.
