





#### Lillian Janie Nelson Pierce, What a wonderful LIFE ....

Jane Nelson was born in Knox, N.Y., December 17<sup>th</sup>, 1930. She was the middle daughter of Vera and John Nelson. She had two sisters, May was her older sister by two years and Martha was her young sister by two years.

Her father built a quaint little house in Knox, N.Y. Mom's main memory of the Knox NY home was when her house burned down when she was 3 years old. The family bought some land in Altamont, N.Y. where her Daddy built another beautiful home and he had a small gas station put in the front of their home that Vera managed while her Dad worked in the Bayer Aspirin Plant.

Altamont is a small town at the foothills of the Bozen Kill Mountain range in upstate N.Y. Her memories of this town have never left her... the train station in the center of town, the general store, colonial homes along main street where all her friends lived, the Reformed church where she sang with her sisters, her piano teacher that lived down town. Everything was within walking distance and everyone knew each other and helped one another during good and bad times.

12/7/1941

At 11 years old while in the 6<sup>th</sup> grade her Daddy was diagnosed with cancer. It was devastating news to their family. He was in his early 30's with a young family. On December 7<sup>th</sup>, 1940 she remembers listening to the radio with her dad when the news of the bombing of Pearl Harbor was broadcasted. After the New Year her Dad had to go to the hospital and Janie had the opportunity to sing with her sisters on the radio so her daddy could hear them. They sang " Dear old Daddy" and," The Yellow Rose of Texas"...He died January 30th, 1944.

Growing up her favorite dog was Judy. Judy would walk to school with the girls everyday. One day Janie left Judy at the school and her Mom made her go back to the school in the dark to get Judy. Judy was so faithful that she never left the school. Janie's mother was a wonderful homemaker and she encouraged her daughters to make their cloths. Janie would make her own broom stick skirts from seed bags and curtains towels. Janie learned allot from her mother and cherished the memories of her childhood home.

Janie played the piano as a child and was admired by her friends for her musical talents. In 7<sup>th</sup> grade she left Altamont and moved to Schenectady NY after her Dad died. Janie spent summers at the Gage Farms where she lived a life a prestige. She would board a train in Schenectady and head to Altamont to visit the Gage family. She has great memories of her time at the Gages Farm. The Gage family owned the Gage Publishing company in Montclair, NJ. The Gage family loved little Janie, so much that they wanted to adopt her, but Janie wouldn't have it. She loved her family dearly and didn't want to be separated from them,

In 1941 the family moved to Schenectady NY where her mother worked at the GE plant to support the family. That was a difficult time in her life and within a two years they decided to leave the area and move to Montclair, NJ.


Janie attended high school in NJ. She had so many wonderful friends in Grover Cleveland High School. In her senior year of high school she met Ellis Pierce at Boulder Beach. Ellis just returned home from the war. Janie thought Ellis was so good looking. They fell in love quickly and soon after they were engaged to be married. Ellis bought Janie a beautiful blue cut diamond ring for their engagement. On July 21, 1949 they were married, it was the hottest day of the year, but no matter they were in love and headed to Greenwood lake for their honeymoon and then on to Niagra Falls.

Ellis and Janie had a great life together. They had a quiver full of children, 8 in all. Charlie, Jane Ann, Mark, Joane, June, Tommy, Todd and Jill. They loved their children well through the years. They live in many different places, but the most memorable was the old green house. Janie tended to the garden, picked berries and loved having big gatherings. She worked hard taking care of the animals in the barn and in the house. The winters were hard, but Janie endured and loved her family through the good and the difficult times. She made her famous home made bread and loved to serve her family and many friends throughout the years. We always had just enough to eat weather it be watercress from the pond or road kill brought home from Todd Janie was a bit of a health nut and kept her family loaded with vitamins and farm fresh foods. She loved us well.




Janie Nelson married Ellis Pierce on 7/22/1949.

John was born 5/9/1906 in Knox, New York and died 1/30/1942 age 35 in NY state. He rests at Fairview Cemetery, Altamont, NY.

John was 5 feet 7.5 inches in height and weight 145. Light complextion, brown hair, blue eyes. He married Veronica Esther 'Vera' Kurzina on 8/25/1928.

John died from Cancer. He left his wife Vera age 35, Mae 12, Janie 11 and Martie 8.







After the reception, the couple left on a tour of New York State and will visit the bride's relatives. They will reside in Caldwell Township.










# Caldwell Twp. Name Changed

CALDWELL (AP) — This Essex County township is known as Fairfield today. the name it had in the 17th and 18th centuries.

Residents voted to change the municipality's name in a referendum yesterday. The vote was 696 for the new name to 558 against. The change went into effect immediately.

The Post Office Department had refused to grant the township a post office because of the confusion with neighboring Caldwell Borough. The department said that without a new name. the municipality would have no post office.

The centuries-old name Fairfield was still being used to identify a small neighborhood in the northernmost section of the township.

Ellis was the primary town councilman who pushed for the name change.

The town voted 696 to 558.

In other words, 55% voted to use the old town name of Fairfield.

A new post office was built for zip code 07004.

Ellis was thrilled. Glen remember him going to his mom Mabel's house to share the news.


