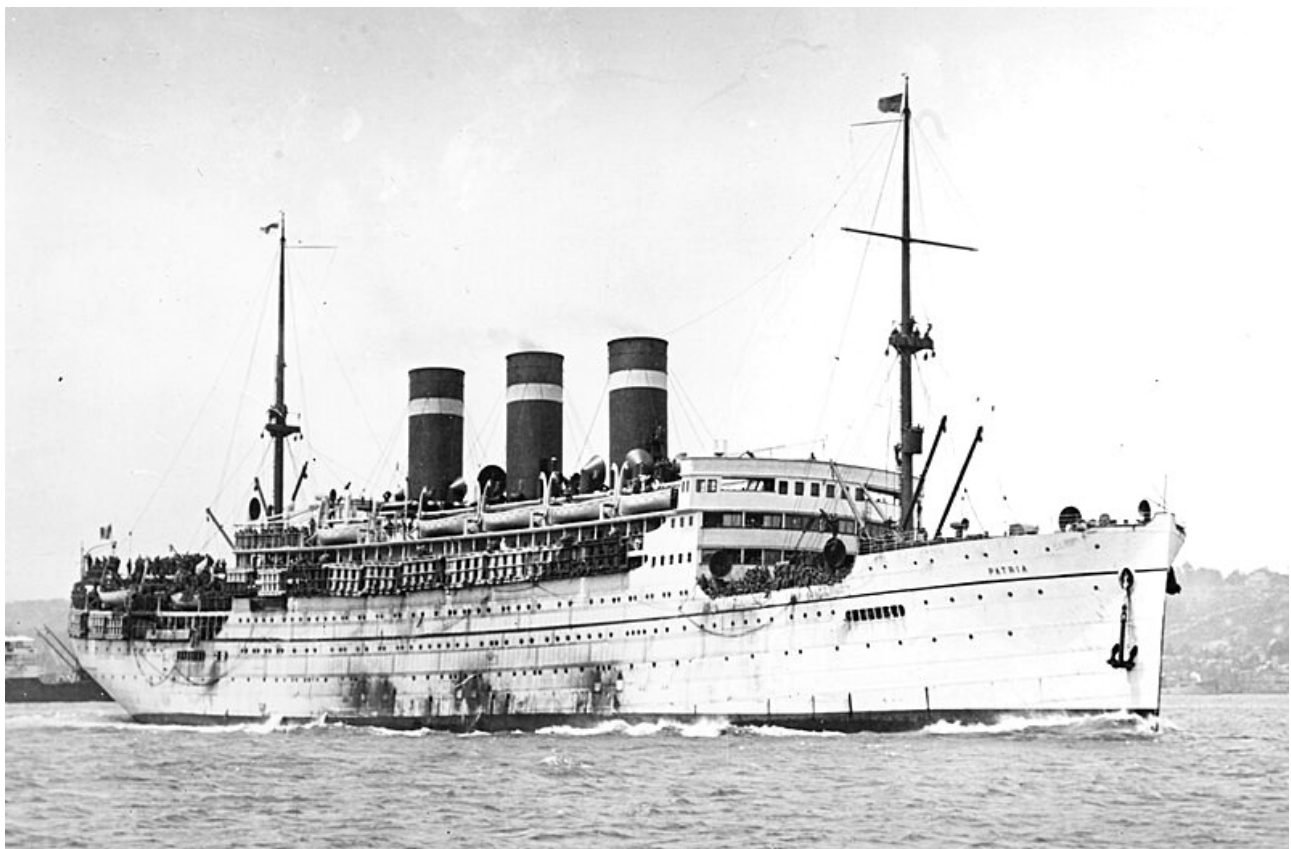

# WAR IS NOW OVER

**Armistice Terms Signed by German Commission at 6 "O'clock French Time" 2:15 a. m. Washington Time This Morning.**

(By The Associated Press War Editor)  
THE WORLD WAR WILL END THIS MORNING AT SIX O'CLOCK PARIS TIME, ELEVEN O'CLOCK WASHINGTON TIME.

THE ARMISTICE WAS SIGNED BY THE GERMAN REPRESENTATIVES AT MIDNIGHT. THIS ANNOUNCEMENT WAS MADE BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT AT 2.15 THIS MORNING.

THE ANNOUNCEMENT WAS MADE VERBALLY BY AN OFFICIAL OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT, WHO SAID:  
"THE ARMISTICE HAS BEEN SIGNED. IT WAS SIGNED AT 5 O'CLOCK A.M. PARIS TIME, AND HOSTILITIES WILL CEASE AT 11 O'CLOCK THIS MORNING PARIS TIME."

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 11.—(By Associated Press.)—Armistice terms have been signed by Germany, the State Department announced at 2.05 o'clock this morning.

There was no announcement as to whether hostilities had ceased or the hour at which they would cease. The department's announcement simply read:  
"The armistice has been signed."

# THE BIG WAR OVER

## Germany Signs Armistice

**State Department Officially Announces That War Ended at Six O'clock This Morning. Armistice Signed Last Night.**

THE WAR IS ENDED! What a prayer of thankfulness must ascend from every heart this day! The signed Armistice terms were returned to Marshal Foch Sunday night; the Armistice went into effect at 6 o'clock Monday morning. The State Department at Washington officially announced this fact at 3:30 this morning, and stated that fighting would cease at 6. The Armistice terms are practically the same as the terms accorded Austria Nov. 4th, only somewhat stronger, and rightly so. Germany will at once disarm, and await the peace terms the Allies see fit to give her! The fighting is ended. The Victory won!

**BEAST OF BERLIN ABDICATES**

The abdication of KAISER WILLIAM and the renunciation of the throne by the Crown Prince was officially announced from Berlin Saturday afternoon at 6:15. The Socialist leader of the Reichstag, Friedrich Ebert, is appointed the temporary Imperial Chancellor. A Rumpsey has been established; it is proposed by the German leaders that a general election be held at once for a national assembly that will settle the future form of government for Germany. Kaiser William has fled to Holland—at last accounts he was two million miles beyond the North Pole, and still running. The red flag of revolution is flying over a large part of Germany; and while the armistice terms were being considered, Gen. Foch continued to SHOOT peace into the Huns. They are now panting of their own medicine—sanarchy seems to be rampant; that which they ascribed upon Russia is "coming home to roost." Verily the Scriptural quotation "whosoever a man swears, that shall he also reap" is again come true.

The word "Casuals" and the name of the group will be entered in the space provided for name of organization, and the Embarkation Personnel Adjutant will sign his name in the space provided for the signature of organization commander.
