They also misidentified the father as Charles Pier. At the time, they lived in the Albion Place Clifton section next to Paterson.

In 2014, Glen proved that Gramps was indeed Albin Wesley Pierce born 1905.

Charles Martin Campbell was born in Dublin Ireland in 1856. At the age of 24 he came to American and settled in Paterson New Jersey. He married Maggie Petty three years later in 1883 at St John's Roman Catholic Church in Paterson. He subsequently went to medical school and graduated from Bellevue Hospital Medical College in 1894. Dr Campbell practiced at St Joseph's Hospital in Paterson. He and Maggie had 5 children, Charlie, Harry, Joe, Elmer and Margaret Louise. Dr Campbell died in 1916 at the age of 59.

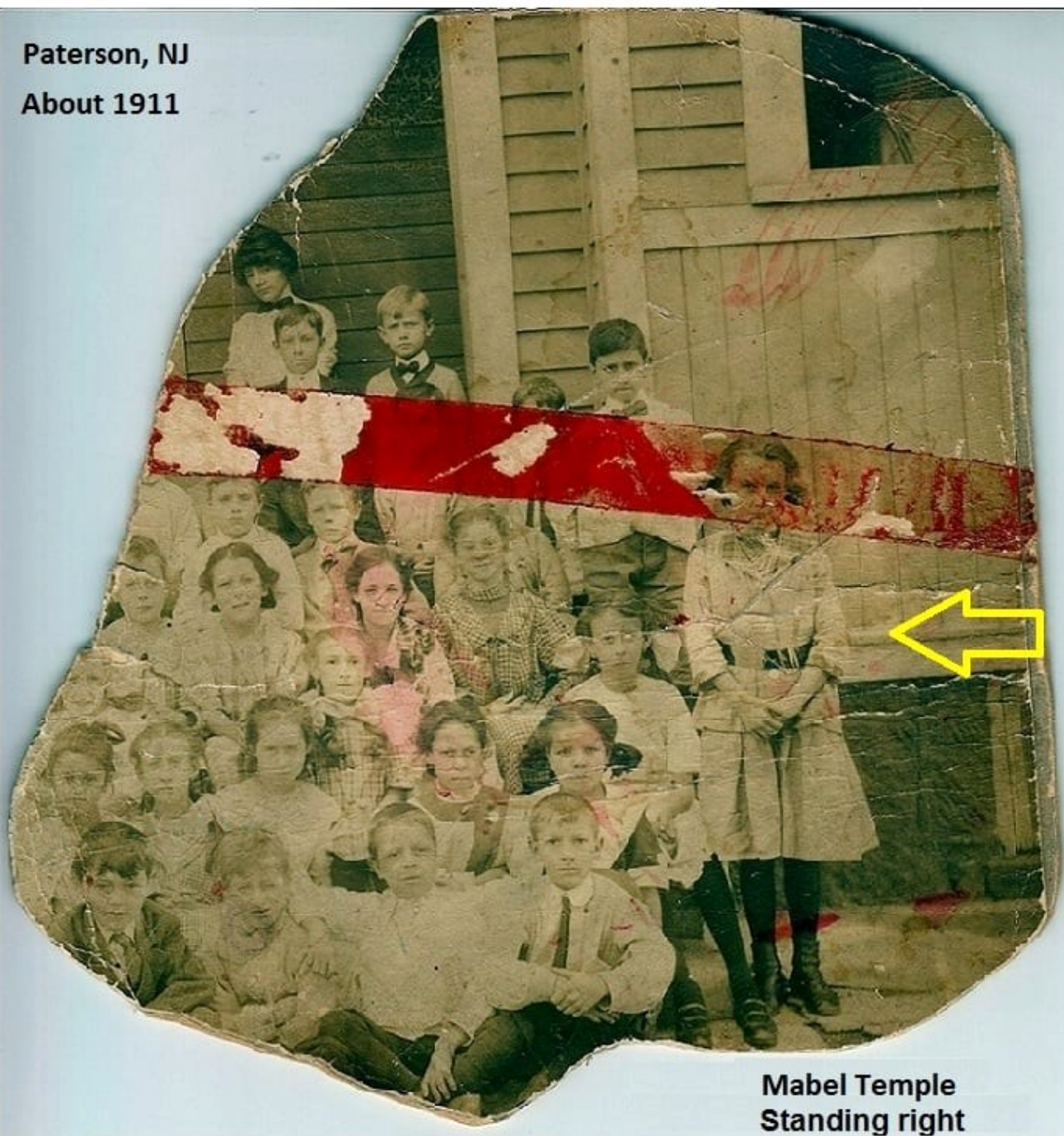

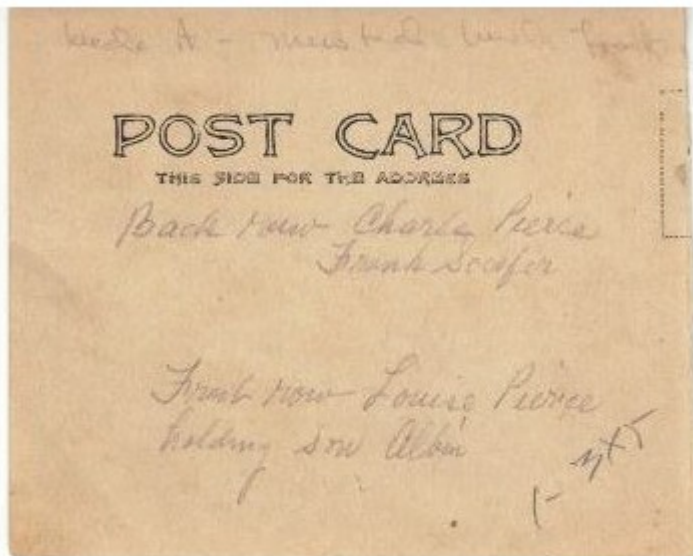

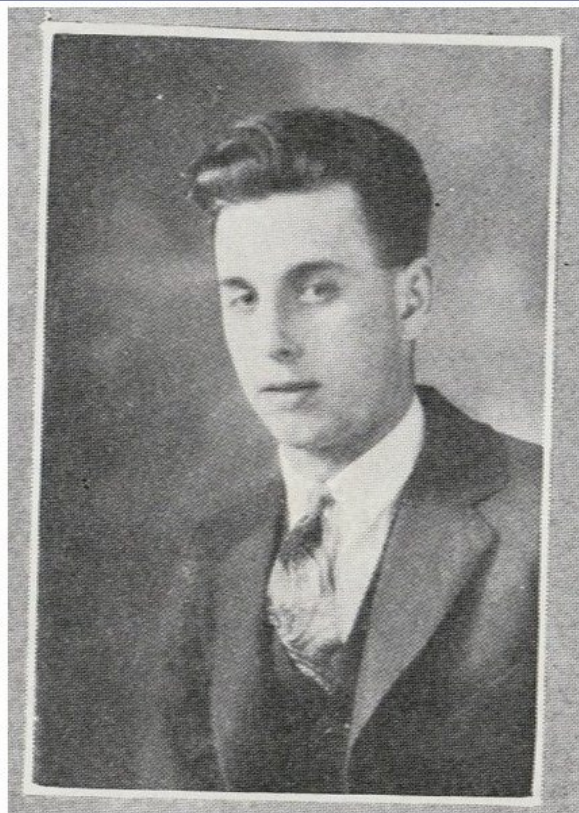

12/31/1924 8 pm, New Year's Eve. Pastor David W. Hutchinson of the Westminister Presbyterian Church at 225 Spring Street, Paterson NJ 07503. The wedding was not at that church but at Mabel's apartment at Gillies Street, Clifton, NJ, I believe.

Albin's birthyear is shown incorrect. Should have been 1905. Also, Mabel name is misspelled as Mable. The middle name Wesley is correct.

Mabel's sister Ellen Temple was a witness and likely best lady. Her future husband Bill Slater also signed the 1924 wedding certificate.

A major find. This **1940** Albin Pierce **draft card** was filled out **by Albin** when Albin was age 35. That was the cutoff draft age, so Albin was not drafted. Plus, he had 3 young boys.

Notice that Albin correctly spells his middle name as Wesley. Also, correctly spells wife's name as **Mabel**. Also, correctly show his birthyear as 1905.

This is proof that their tombstone has errors.

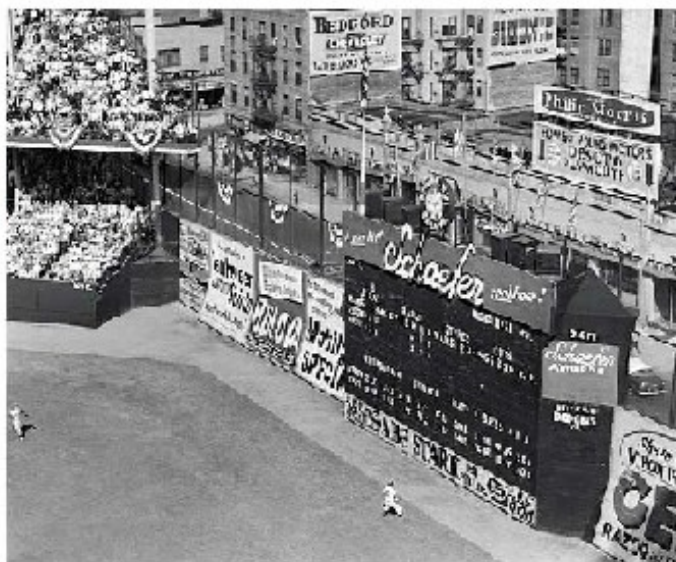
We watched many night games in 1954-57. I always fell asleep and couldn't wait to ask Gramps the next morning, who won the game.

Resident of Fairfield Designer With Kay Electric Co.

Albin Westley Pierce of 15 Glen Ave., Fairfield, an electrical engineer, died yesterday in Mountainside Hospital. He was 63.

Mr. Pierce, who was born in Paterson and had lived most of his life in the Caldwell area, was a graduate of Montclair High School and attended Columbia University, New York.

1967 Obit - Middlename should be Wesley. He lived at 16 Glen and son Ellis at 15 Glen. Albin's dates are 9/3/1905 - 4/17/1967.

He served in the United States Maritime Service and attained the rank of first mate.

In 1928, he went to work for the Public Service Electric & Gas Co. as an engineer. Six years later Mr. Pierce was named New Jersey-Pennsylvania area supervisor for the U.S. Agriculture Department.

In 1937 Mr. Pierce joined General Motors in Linden. He served as chief representative of the company at the 1939 World's Fair and designed the lighting effects for the company's Futurama Pavilion.

For the last 13 years he was employed by the Kay Electric Co., Pine Brook, as a designer of electrical equipment.

Mr. Pierce leaves his wife, Mrs. Mable Temple Pierce; four sons, Albert, Charles, George and Joseph, all of Fairfield; his mother, Mrs. Louise Pierce of Fairfield; a brother, Charles of Montclair; a sister, Mrs. Marion Gallagher of Toms River, and 19 grandchildren.

Services will be Thursday at the Parker Funeral Home, 47 Main St., Little Falls.
