

His father was a motorman for the Newark NJ trolley's.



Funeral services for George L. Pierce, 43, of 86 Santa Clara avenue, who died Tuesday afternoon following a seven weeks' illness from bronchial pneumonia, will be held Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock, the Scottish Rite in charge. The body will lie in state from 11 o'clock until 2 o'clock Friday at the Masonic temple, South Main street.

Mr. Pierce was employed as general foreman of the automatic screw machine department of the Delco, since coming to Dayton four years ago. Prior to that time, he was associated with the Western Electric company in New Jersey and Chicago for 17 years.

Besides his wife, Mrs. Elizabeth Pierce, he is survived by two brothers, Arthur W., of Chicago, and Oscar, of Newark, and two sisters, Mrs. Jensen and Mrs. Plemenik, both of Newark.
