4/1/2004 from Joyce Hoagland Hilley: "When I first started doing this research, I said something to my dad Donald Hoagland about Francis Pierce's mother and he finished my sentence by saying 'she was a Jacobus' before I mentioned either family name."

5/31/2004 from Joyce Hoagland Hilley: "While going through the census pages, I happened upon Joseph and Nancy Pierce in 1880. They lived next door to Jacobuses." Could they be Nancy's relatives?

The 1880 next door Jacobuses were Thomas Jacobus, age 65, wife Emeline, age 60, daughter Rachel Ann, age 38, son-in-law William Husk, age 39, children of Rachel Ann and William, Estella age 15 and Frank age 10. Since Nancy was 59 at that time, perhaps Thomas was her brother?

More confusion, 1990s J. Lee Goodson, whom Glen and Joyce met, said Nancy's maiden name is listed as Nancy Bush on Albert's marriage certificate.

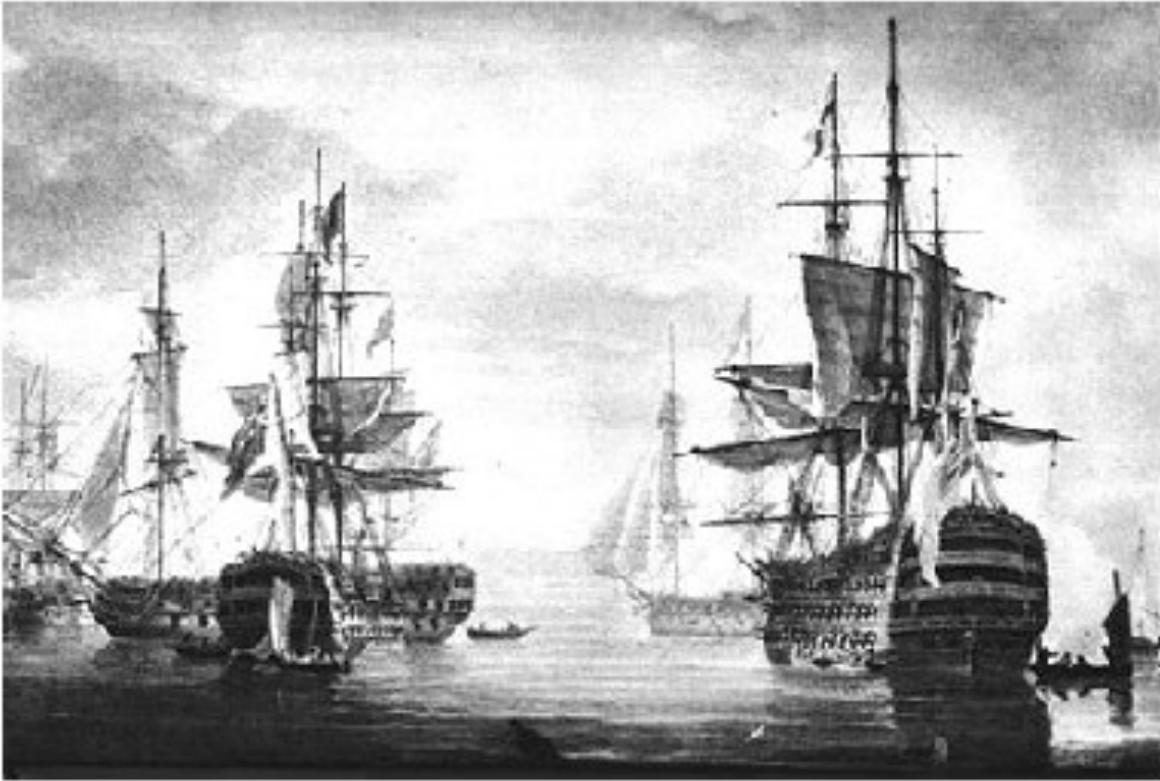
Other researcher's consider Nancy as a Jacobus.

War of 1812

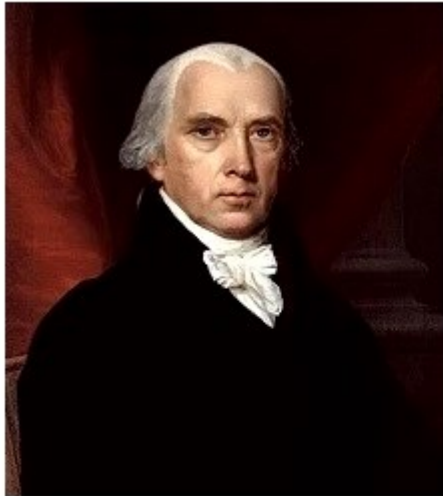
August 1814
