





CIRCUS LIFE FROM THE INSIDE.

Dr. Riley, Circus Physician, Gives Some Interesting Facts.

"I served on the United States hospital corps through the Spanish-American war and put in two years' practice on the Panama canal," says Dr. F. J. Riley, the Chicago physician, "but the strangest years of my life have been the past six seasons I have served as head physician of Ringling Brothers' circus, which comes to Detroit, June 16.

"My duties as doctor in this unique city of tents are not arduous, though I am kept pretty busy with bruises and sprains and now and then a fractured bone. Circus folk are naturally healthy, but like the usual run perfectly well people, they stand in the greatest fear of sickness. When they really are in need of medical attention, they show the least concern. I recall one aerialist who fell from the dome of the tent and on the way down great piece of flesh from his arm on a sharp steel projection on the lower rigging. He was pretty badly used up when they brought him into my tent. I suggested using cointo my tent. I suggested using cocaine to deaden the pain. He laughed and said.

"Never mind the dope, Doc. Get busy. Tie that bum arm up with a piece of stiff canvas so I can work tonight"

"While I was sewing up his arm, he discussed his fall as calmly as though he were merely having his nails manieured

"I was greatly surprised when I first joined the circus to find the people around me a good natured band of men and women possessing intelligence, culture and good common sense. They are for the most part

well-bred, and they profit by the advantages of extensive travel. Many of the men are college bred, having found their way into the circusthrough college athletics

"I am far from the opinion that circus life is demoralizing. It offers fewer temptations than does a city. I believe a boy with Ringling Brothers' circus is in better hands than the average city boy. The benefit to a man's health cannot be estimated in words.

"It is impossible to comprehend the magnitude of this big institution till you have traveled with it for at least six months. It is like city in itself.

"The show has its own police force, lawyers and various mechanics and artisians. In the circus hotel over 5,000 meals are cooked and eaten every day in the week. It is a more domestic life than the public thinks. We are like the snall not in respect of its speed by any means, but because we always carry our home around with us. We are a happy family, and quite contented."




