Frank did not marry. Etta died age 14 from an 1891 kerosene lamp accident.

William and his brother Theodore Pearce were part of the 1861 committee for the Union Pic-Nic at the FDRC.

I need to find William's Civil War records at Washington DC.  
I assume that Theodore was not in the service.

On **7/1/1863** , these fellows were drafted into the US Army. William Henry Pearce age 25 is identified as a Caldwell (really Fairfield) NJ farmer. I see some cousins on the list. This was also the first day of the bloody Gettysburg PA Battle. **Don't know his unit.**

On 7/1/1863, William was age 24.5. He was single, marrying on 6/16/1870. There is a William H. Pierce in the NJ 12th who was wounded. Need more research at Natl Archives.

1880 Federal census: William Pearce age 41 and Jennie age 31 lived at 24 Chetham Ave, Newark NJ. Son Frank Pearce age 8 and daughter Etta Pearce age 3 live with them. In 1891, living at 142 Bloomfield Ave, Newark NJ.

1900 Federal census: William and Jennie Pearce lived at 110 1/2 Bleeker Street, Newark NJ. Will did Masonry work. Their son **Fred** age 28 lived with them.

## 1913 William Henry Pearce died

At 56 Halsey Street, Newark NJ.

### HIS FALL FROM HAHNE'S NEW ADDITION FATAL

It is believed today that the death of **William H. Pearce**, of 110½ Bleecker street, whose body was found in the basement of a new building, was the result of an accidental fall. At noon yesterday workmen arrived at the building, which is being erected as an addition to Hahne & Co.'s building, at 56 Halsey street, and found the body.

A misstep on an unfinished stairway is thought to have plunged the 70-year-old man to his death. His skull was fractured and his neck broken. **Pearce** had been an inventor. He is survived by a widow and one son, Frank S. **Pearce**.

1913: After William died suddenly, Jennie age 64 only had her son Frank to support her. There was no Social Security (1935). Jennie lived 20 more years, passing in 1933.

Frank was a **bookkeeper** at Prudential Insurance Company in Newark NJ.

1915: Only Jennie and son Frank lived at 110 1/2 Bleecker St.

1920: Jennie and Frank still lived at 110 1/2 Bleecker Street, Newark NJ. As a means for income, they had 5 lodgers living there too.

This family unit ended when Frank died 10/24/1942 age 70.
