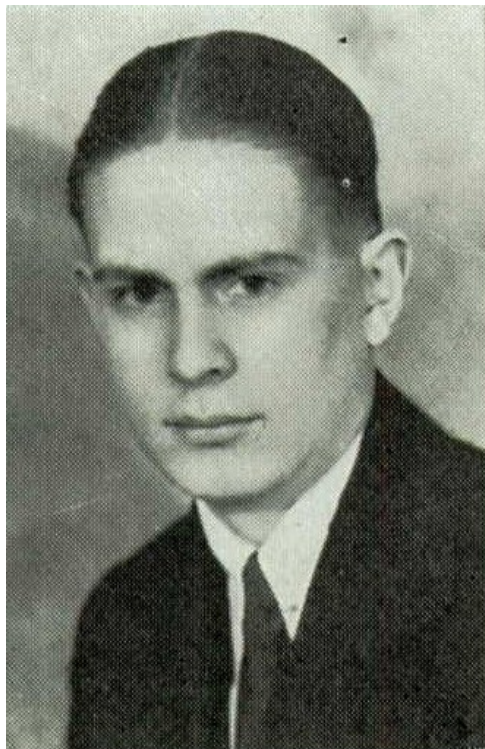

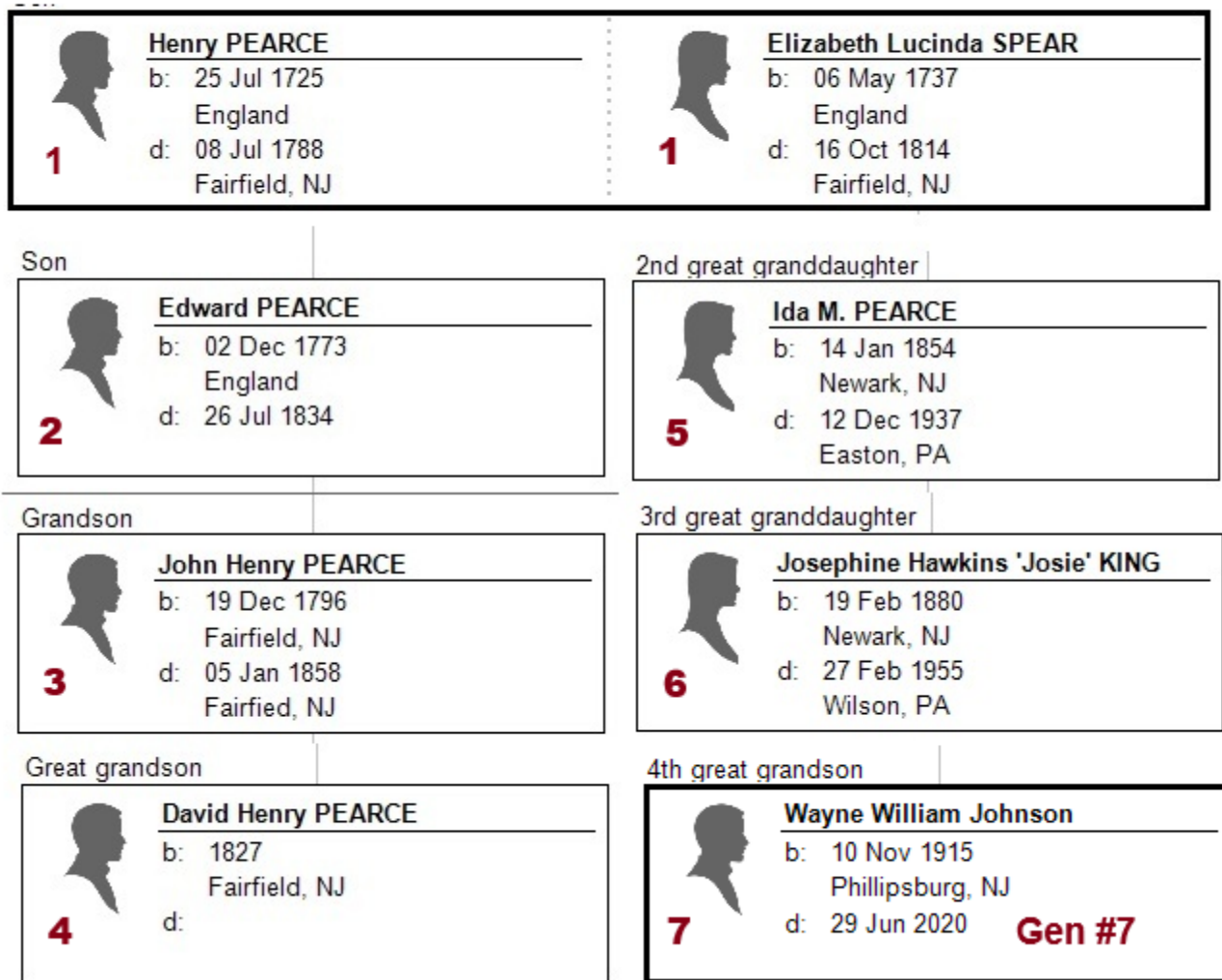

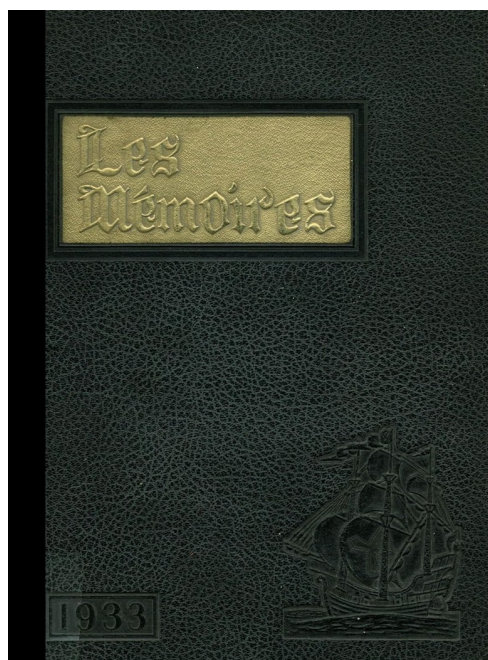

Junior year band for Wayne Johnson. Drums.

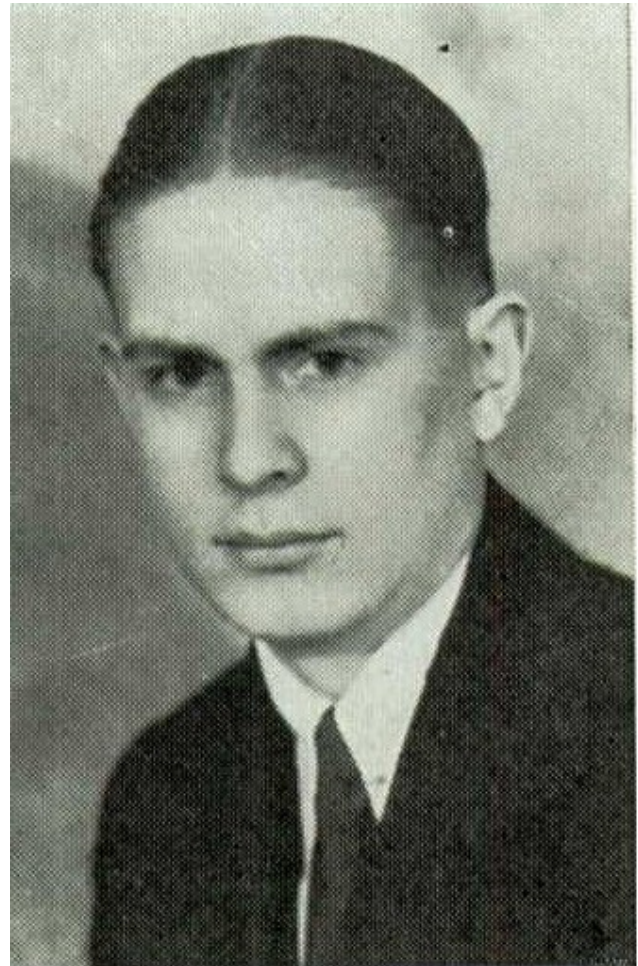

5/7/1945 Seattle Washington: Wayne age 30 and Daisey age 27 were married, both raised in Easton PA. The parents could not attend. WW2 was going on.

It appears that they married on a **US Navy** base in Seattle. The **next day** 5/8/1945, Victory in Europe (**VE Day**) was declared.

"This is a solemn but a glorious hour. I only wish that President Franklin D. Roosevelt had lived to witness this day.

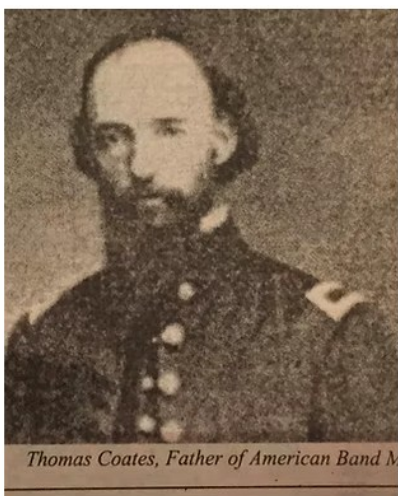
General Eisenhower informs me that the forces of Germany have surrendered to the United Nations. **The flags of freedom fly over all Europe.**"
