





\$13 per month pay.




George Henry Pearce was age 17.5 when he patriotically enlisted 1862 in a 9-month NJ regiment. They were led by an incompetent officer.

Franklin's Crossing June 5-13. Reached Washington, D.C., June 17. Mustered out at Newark, N.J., June 27, 1863.





1863 JAMES HOPE painting of the NJ 26th regiment VA camp

George was a cable/trolley motorman in Newark NJ. Grew up in Irvington, NJ.









Trolley has a pole on roof for electric power. Cable car used steam power that was under the car. Newark NJ about 1901.






MARKET STREET-LOOKING WEST FROM BROAD.






BROAD STREET-LOOKING SOUTH FROM MARKET STREET.

Oscar's 1918 WW1 registration card shows him age 37, tall with blue eyes and gray hair. He wrote the nearest relative as his oldest sister Mrs. Mabel Pearce Jensen. Their parents were deceased by 1912.






