



The depot brigades also received soldiers returning home at the end of the war and completed their out processing and discharges.

Clifford died 8/17/1946. Clifford's mother Jessie and sister Grace applied for a free Vets headstone. Jessie died on 10/6/1946, 2 months after Clifford. Hence, Grace took over the application.

Notice the birth year confusion. Vets (their red marks) figured it out that 1890 was correct. But too late. 1893 was used on the tombstone.
