

Dora is at Prospect Hill Cem, Caldwell NJ as are her parents. I don't have a picture of her tombstone.

This is the **Munson Pierce home**, in 2024, at **18 Orchard Square**, Caldwell, NJ. On the right is Personette Street that leads to Bloomfield Ave by the Caldwell Presbyterian church.

They had 2 daughters, Jetta born 1879 and Dora Pierce born 1880.



Dora graduated Caldwell NJ High School in the 1898 class of 4 students.

Dora lived down the street in 1930 at 46 Orchard Square. Munson died 1920 and his wife Jenny in 1929. After the parents died, Dora moved to her childhood 18 Orchard home until she died in **1941**.

Her sister **Jetta Pierce** married 11/25/1914 to David Carr, moving to West Caldwell. Glen spoke a few times in 1982 with their daughter Janet who lived next door at 20 Orchard Square.

After graduation, when the NY and NJ Telephone Company opened its first central office switchboard at Hasler's Caldwell Drugstore with 12 subscribers, **Dora** was the first phone operator. By 1905 there were 81 phones in service and then increased to 538 by 1912.

This former schoolhouse was remodeled in **1875** for a Caldwell NJ pharmacy. It was sold 1881 to Dr. Edward Everett Peck (1859-1918) and renamed **Hasler's Pharmacy** run by William Hasler and later his brother Herman Hasler.

Local historian Bev Crifasi notes that the 295 Bloomfield Ave pharmacy burned down in 1897. It was rebuilt with bricks.

Peck and Hasler are distant relatives in the Henry Pearce tree. Peck became a Republican Caldwell Mayor 1916-1918.

John Collins ran the pharmacy 1955-1994.


1891: Dr. Edward Peck installed the 1st telephone in the Caldwell NJ area at his Halser's Drug Store, 295 Bloomfield Ave, Caldwell NJ.

Dora M. Pierce (1880-1941) later became the switchboard operator at age 17. The 4/19/1902 Caldwell Progress wrote:

"Miss Dora Pierce is now in charge of the central telephone station at Hasler's Pharmacy."

Dora also did bookkeeping at her father's Butcher Shop in Roseland. Bookkeeping was her career, working also at the nearby **Thorward** & Van Duyne Market at 336 Bloomfield ave, Caldwell NJ.

"The market opened in 1856 by Frank Dobbins who later sold it to George H Vanderhoof, who next sold it to George Lewis Thorward and his partner Mr. Van Duyne." (Kathleen Moore.2010, Thorwald relative)


