## MILLIONS OF BLACKBIRDS.

Eat the Early Crops and Make a Noise Like Escaping Steam.

Blackbirds have been so numerous in and around the Big Piece, above Two Bridges, that the farmers have talked of trying some means of getting rid of them, says the Paterson Press. They have not appeared in large numbers yet, for this season, although a week or two ago some stragglers showed up, indicating that the swarms of last spring might come back. There is a small island above "Big Piece," near the Horseneck Bridge, and for two years blackbirds by the million have covered it. They eat all the early crops and set up such a screaming that it is almost impossible to live near them. One afternoon last spring per-

sons on the road within a mile of this island heard a noise that sounded like half a dozen locomotives blowing off steam. It could not be imagined what occasioned it until the island was reached, and the leaves on the trees were almost hidden in the clouds of birds that kept up the screeching.
