



Westfield — Pfc. Harry Boyton, son of Mr. and Mrs. George Boyton of Summit Rd., is home on a 30day furlough before going to a camp in Louisiana for further training for the Pacific,

Inducted into the service in March, 1943, he trained at Camp Bowie, Tex., and Camp Pickett, Va. He has participated in five major battles and has been awarded the Bronze Arrow. Prior to entering the service, Pfc, Boyton was employed at the Echo Lake Country Club as caretaker of grounds.



Also home for 30 days is Private Boyton's cousin, Sgt. Charles Boyton, son of William Boyton of Summit Rd., after more than two years overseas. Wounded twice in action, he wears the Purple Heart and the Infantry Medal. Inducted into the Army in March, 1943, he received his basic training at Camp Wheeler, Ga., and then was transferred to Shenango, Pa. Sergeant Boyton was a senior in the Regional High School, Springfield, when he entered the service.

Jennie was the daughter of Frank Pierce and Maggie Lee of Pine Brook, NJ.




Trivia: Jennie and big brother Clarence share 8/22 birth date but 6 years apart.





3/27/2020 Ramona was busy making hospital masks for free to a Montana hospital.
