After the Civil War, Charles and his first wife **Lauretta Elizabeth CRANE** were married **12/29/1867** at Pequannock NJ, possibly the First Reformed Church, Pompton Plains NJ.

Mrs. Lauretta Crane Pierce died 10/29/1869 from lung consumption (TB). They were living in Montville, NJ. Tuberculosis (TB) was the leading cause of death in 1869.

They apparently had no children. Charles age 28 moved to **Newark NJ** for work. He was a Foreman for a building contractor. The work must have taken his mind off the deceased Lauretta.

He next met and married his second wife **"Alice F. "Stella" STALKER** on 5/25/1880 in Wisconsin. They had 8 children. Life was getting better for Charles.

As noted earlier, our Charles Davis Pierce age 21 enlisted to the Union Army in 1863. He enlisted in New York. Probably not in NYC.

After the Civil War, Charles married Laurretta in 1867 in NJ. She died in 1869.

Charles married 13 years later to Stella Stalker of Lemonweir, Wisconsin. Her father was raised in upstate New York and settled at Lemonweir.

Interestingly, Stella's father **Albert Stalker** was drafted into the Civil War Union Army at age 39, 9/1864 to 6/1865 in the Wisconsin 17th regiment, Company U. He was captured in 1865 and spent 3 months at the Confederate **Libby Prison** (Richmond, Virginia).

I imagine the father-in-law Albert and son-in-law Charles spoke of their Civil War experiences.

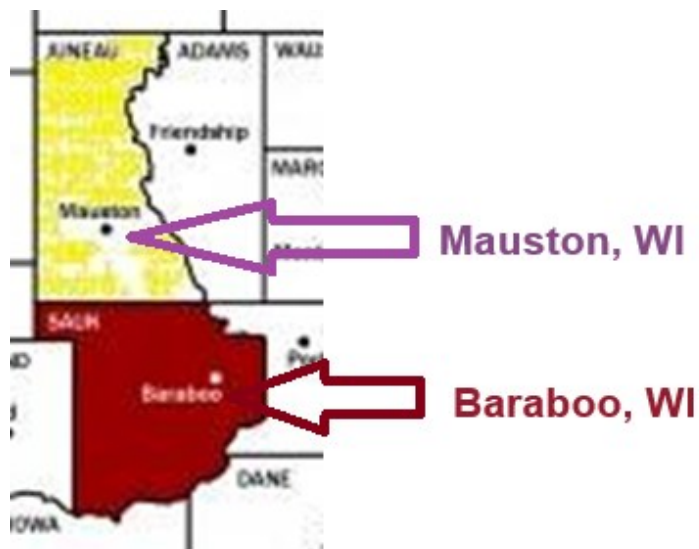

Briggs and the musical numbers were given by Mr. Briggs, Miss Mayme Shaw, Mrs. Lee Cleveland and C. A. Melzl, with Miss Nettie Kimball at the organ. Those from out of town were Mr. and Mrs. Byrd Pierce, Mauston, and Eugene Stalker, Elroy. The bearers were John Howard, Charles Smith, Byrd Pierce and three sons, Earl, Will and Charles Pierce. ### Watch Stopped at 8:26

At the inquest over the remains of Ray Pierce, drowned in Narrows Creek on Thursday morning, the jury decided that he came to his death by accidental drowning. There was a bruise on one side of his person which showed that he probably had been injured when thrown from the horse he was riding and by means of which he no doubt attempted to cross the stream. His watch stopped at 8:26 which was the time of the accident. His mother told our correspondent that the young man was a good swimmer and no doubt could have saved himself if not injured. He leaves, besides his parents, five brothers and two sisters. Funeral Saturday at 1:00 at the Butterfield church in the town of Excelsior and interment in the Butterfield cemetery.

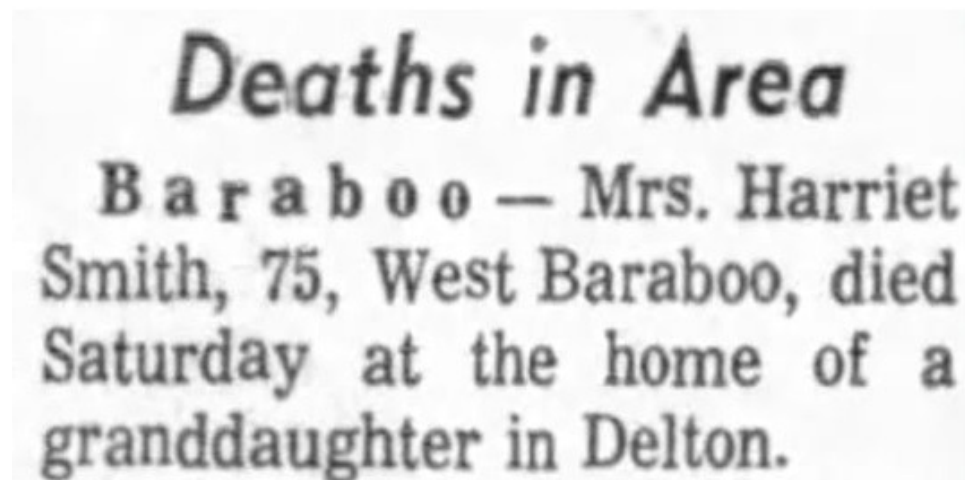


Not much is known about the 2nd wife Bridget, apparently married after Norma died in 1978.

# Edward Pierce Dies Suddenly
